PARLIAMENTARIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

The parliamentarian is an officer appointed by the president/captain. She leads the **Pledge of Allegiance** at the meetings, and typically serves as an advisor to ensure that proper procedures are followed.

Parliamentary Procedure is a set of rules for conduct at meetings that allows everyone to be heard, and to make decisions without confusion. It is advised, and important, that each elected and appointed board officer have a current edition of the *International Constitution and Bylaws*, and become familiar with *DUP's Order of Procedure and Flag Etiquette*; a pamphlet that simplifies parliamentary procedure.

The **Bylaws** are specific rules by which the organization is governed. Following what is outlined in the Bylaws makes for an orderly and enjoyable meeting, without question as to what is what. The majority of answers to questions can be found within the pages of the Bylaws.
